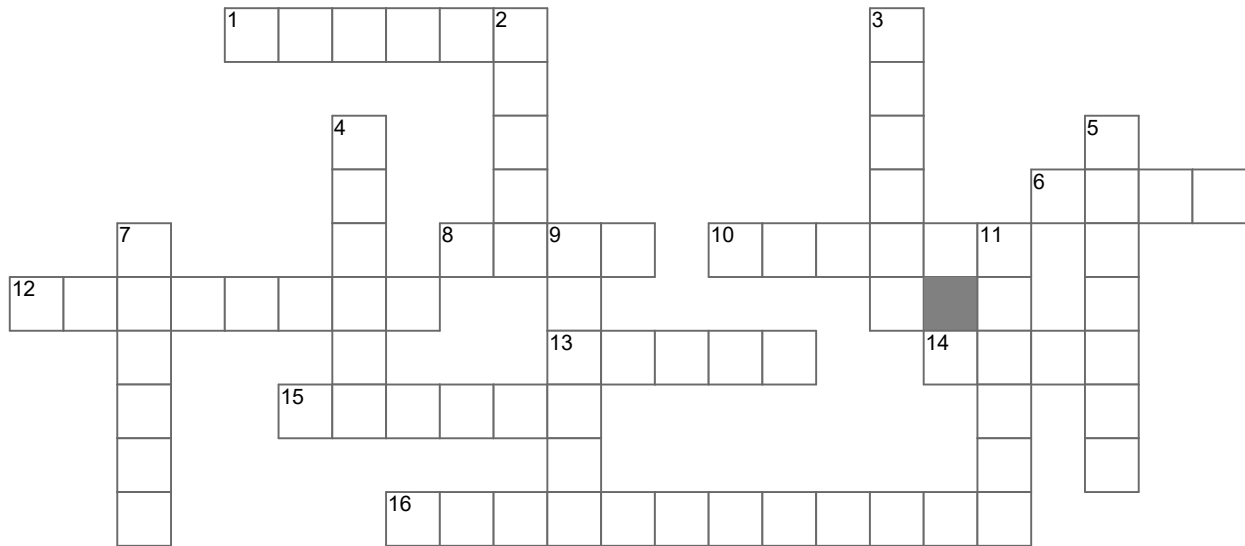

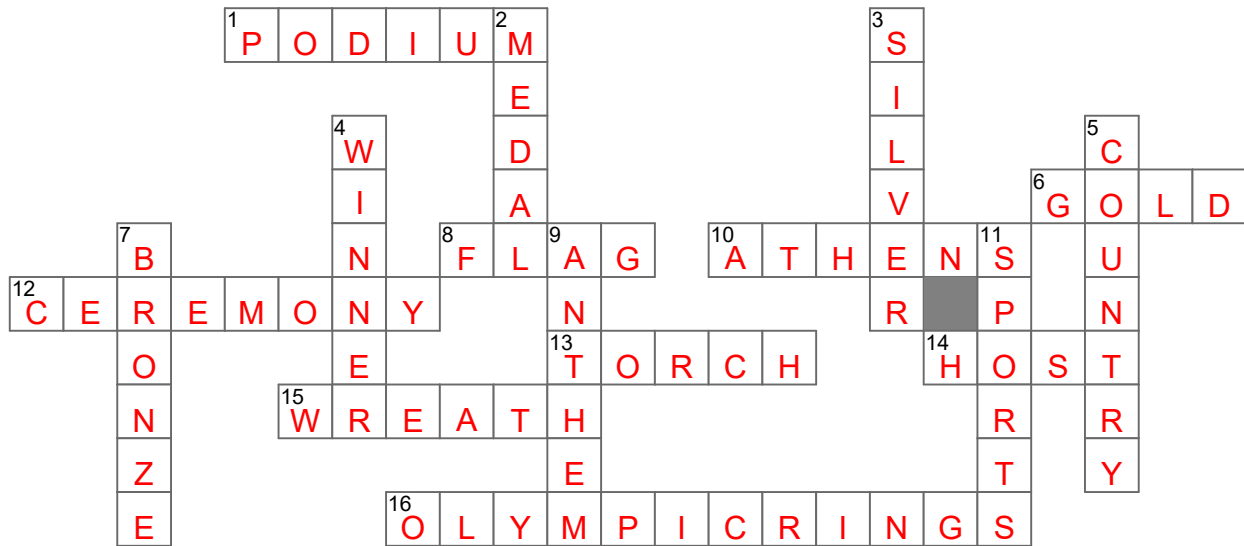
2. Given as an award for excellence or achievement.
